  - A. Summer 2019/Fall 2019 Enrollment Dates
    - 1. Tuesday, 3/26/19- Priority
    - 2. Thursday, 3/28/19- Four year cohort seniors (new category)- request to define category (TBD)
    - 3. Tuesday, 4/2/19- Seniors and those graduating
    - 4. Thursday, 4/4/19- Juniors
    - 5. Tuesday, 4/9/19- Sophomores
    - 6. Thursday, 4/11/19- Freshman
  - B. Admission Terms/Sessions
