  - A. New Undergraduate Degree
    - 1. BA in Global Studies starts this fall
    - 2. 39 credit hours of multidisciplinary study
    - 3. All 8 departments included
    - 4. Curricular and thematic interests
    - 5. Email to be sent with curriculum and job outlook
  - B. Other New Programs
    - 1. 4 + 1 BA/NPH Health Policy Management
    - 2. 2 new certificates (no required prerequisites)
      - a. GIS- Geographic Information Systems

  - A. Doral College Courses

  - 1. Contacted by telephone and email to enroll in Spring and Summer
  - 2. 439 students with 1.95 and higher enrolled in spring but not summer or fall
  - 3. Email to students with 20-24 credit count; 90 not yet enrolled

  - 3. Capps at \$1,000; 1<sup>st</sup> payment may be covered
