- A. Civics Literacy Requirement
  - 1. New updated policy on October 5<sup>th</sup>
  - 2. If POS 2041 or AMH 2040 taken as dual enrollment, will not satisfy requirement; if dual enrollment at FIU, may or may not satisfy- email April with questions
  - 3. Civics requirement only for Fall and Summer 2018 FTIC's
  - 4. Civic courses taken outside of Florida do not count
  - If requirement satisfied in system before October 5<sup>th</sup> will remain satisfied in system
  - 6. Civics exam
    - a. An option for students who don't need either of the two courses
    - b. Score results immediate; score of 60 required
    - c. Can be repeated; register when available
    - d. Free exam
    - e. Course on Canvas, CIV 222

    - 1. Beyond recruitment; work with Exploratory population

    - 4. Students will meet with BC advisors and FIU advisors
    - 5. Goal is to help both institutions and better prepare students
