- III. Correction and Approval of Last Meeting's Minutes

- IV. Adoption of the Agenda
 - A. Sen. Legoute motioned for the meeting to be recorded; Sen. Lachapelle: request to be made prior to the meeting, will put an amendment.
- V. Invited Speakers
 - A. Maria Franzblau: The Ceasefire Now resolution review requested; since the attack on Sept 7 the IDF started the military operation, over 30,000 Palestinians have been killed since. The system has been that of apartheid; the Ceasefire Now resolution proposed to SGA to endorse. There have been multiple events in support on Palestine, the resolution got a large number of signatures.

VI. Public Forum

A. Oscar Alvarez: wants to reiterate the words of Maria Franzblau, to demand the ceasefire.

Yishmael Columna: Palestinians are being forced to stay in North Gaza by Hamas; ceasefire will continue destruction; the military operation aims to bring peace. Tara Mahmoud: asking to stop making it political and make it about humanity. Zuhra Akhtar: institutions work to marginalize people; students should speak out and condemn the atrocities.

Valentina Jadue: thinks that it is the students' duty to represent the student body, students support a ceasefire.

Judith C.: supports a ceasefire along with the student body, protests have been held on campus.



Esther: there is need to define genocide, what is going on in Gaza does not fall under genocide since the population of Gaza has doubled in the past decades.

Ismel Hernandez: supports a ceasefire since the civilians are suffering, hospitals destroyed which falls under war crime category.

Felipe Ramos: think that the resolution is important, the military complex has a part in the ongoing conflict.

Sen. Fleites motioned to close the public forum, passed; the forum is closed.

- XI. New Business
 - A. President Sutton signed an executive order for meeting recording to be done if approved by the majority vote.

Sen. Lachapelle proposed to move to a placard vote. With 17 in favor, 8 against, 2 abstention the proposal to record future senate meetings passed.

Sen. Brochinsky: was assigned to the resolution today and did not have time to investigate it, so it is not on the agenda yet. Next meeting will not take place due to prior commitments.

Sen. Stone: work on the housing matter is ongoing, will have meetings on the topic, hopes to have another resolution. Will investigate numbers for lower and upper classmen on-campus housing.

Sen. Salup-Cid: the Rules Committee will need to investigate the resolution; review can be done with one of the co-sponsors since the goal of the matter is to represent the students.

Sen. Legoute: SGA is here to advocate for and hear every student, the current events happening in the region are unfortunate. Global Culture Fair event was held with high attendance. Open to work will all other members

Sen. Lachapelle: the largest meeting attendance to date, SGA's goal is to hear every student. Last week's events were successful with large attendance, more events upcoming in Spring.
